

children, some 40 years ago, enjoying trips to that special place. The farm has evolved from 3 buildings and one horse to now many small buildings, settler's hut, tree house, an old general store and even a full-sized Viking ship and more.

Schools took field trips there, arts and crafts flourished. After David Moon's

mother, Ella passed, David sold the site to a nonprofit to continue the legacy. In 2021 Grand Valley Equine Assisted Learning Center purchased the facility

nter purchased the facility I took a trip out to the farm and there I met Michelle Eccles, Ellie Fagan, and Jordan Hamm.

Michelle currently works for GVEALC as a LPC helping to service mental health

clients. She was contacted by Eric Dinel and Mark Carlson with Colorado Agribusiness and Equine Science Association (CAESA) regarding a homeschool enrichment program. They were looking to bring a state funded enrichment program to the farm where homeschool kids could come learn all

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about horses and what it takes to own a horse of their own. When they contacted her, she jumped at the job. Her main roll with the program is head instructor, and the behavior lead.

Ellie has a background in FFA, 4-H and growing up on a ranch. Ellie has shown Dressage horses all her life alongside her mom. She was brought into the program to be a bridge between the two organizations, GVEALC and CAESA. Ellie also works closely with the families to provide all communication, student pictures, and funny quotes the kids say throughout the day. Ellie also works with the students as a co-teacher.

Jordan works at the farm as an Equine/ Farm Manager and Volunteer Coordinator when not being a co-teacher for the homeschool program. She has a background in 4-H, FFA and showing horses in western disciplines and rodeo. Aside from working closely with the therapist during sessions she also helps maintain the property and playhouses.

Jay D Muller and Suzanne Muller are the new owners of Moon Farm and the founders of GVEALC. Since the purchase of the farm in 2021 they have been working to merge the two businesses together. They are currently in the process of adding an indoor arena to the property where they will be able to service clients year-round. The addition of CAESA has brought a new dynamic to the facility and opened several doors for GVEALC. CAESA provides industry-based experiential learning opportunities for K-12 students in animal and plant sciences, agriculture, food, horticulture, entrepreneurship and natural resource management. While this may be the first program of its kind on the Western Slope it is sure to not be the last.

Avis Loshbaugh


